FOREWORD

The Government of Sikkim has placed the utmost importance on the education sector by dedicating nearly 20% of the State's budget to it. This significant investment has resulted in substantial progress, as evidenced by the exemplary performance of our students in competitive examinations, the achievement of doctoral and post-doctoral degrees, and successful employment both within India and abroad.

Numerous initiatives, jointly managed at the national and state levels, have been undertaken to enhance access to quality education, especially for economically and socially disadvantaged groups. In response to the thriving competition from private schools, the Government sector has made concerted efforts to provide parents and children with what they most need and want: quality education that opens doors to better life opportunities.

Education encompasses numerous indicators, with 'values' being of prime importance. Beyond academic excellence, our children are taught to respect women and elders, maintain peace and harmony, show concern for the environment, uphold cleanliness, contribute to society, and participate in programs such as yoga and self-defense (for girls). Training for School Managing Committees and community mobilization programs are also organized.

Government interventions have successfully secured accreditation for seven Sikkim Government Colleges by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), marking a significant achievement in the Higher Education sector. The RUSA (Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan) scheme has played a crucial role in augmenting college infrastructure and improving the quality of higher education through enhanced funding, modern facilities, and capacity-building initiatives.

The Samagra Shiksha project has successfully reintegrated most out-ofschool children into the educational system. Incentives such as the mid-day meal scheme, free uniforms, textbooks, raincoats, shoes, and socks have helped retain students in the school system. This scheme has also provided infrastructural support to accommodate a larger number of students and includes components for the education of differently-abled children.

The PM SHRI (Pradhan Mantri Schools for Rising India) scheme has significantly enhanced educational infrastructure and resources in schools across the state, providing modern facilities, quality teaching, and holistic development opportunities for students. This initiative complements existing

efforts like Samagra Shiksha, further ensuring that quality education is accessible to all children, including those with special needs.

In line with these approaches and the Education Policy, the Government launched several initiatives to improve the teaching-learning process and teacher development programs. The department made comprehensive efforts to implement these Government policies. This report consolidates the activities from various sections of the Department.

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SAMAGRA SHIKSHA & ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

Samagra Shiksha is an overarching programme for the school education sector extending from pre-school to class 12 and has been, therefore, prepared with the broader goal of improving school effectiveness measured in terms of equal opportunities for schooling and equitable learning outcomes. It subsumes the three erstwhile Schemes of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) and Teacher Education (TE).

Goals: -

- 1. By 2030, ensure that all boys and girls complete free, equitable and quality primary and secondary education leading to relevant and effective learning outcomes.
- 2. By 2030, eliminate gender disparities in education and ensure equal access to all levels of Education and vocational training for the vulnerable, including persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples and children in vulnerable situations.

Main Outcomes of the Scheme are envisaged as Universal Access, Equity and Quality, Vocationalisation of Education and strengthening of Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs).

a. Free Textbook

Provision of Free Textbook to the students of Elementary Stage is RtE entitlement. The provision is provided to Textbook Section. The provision is as details below: -

b. Free Uniform

Under the RtE entitlement, the students studying at Elementary Stage are provided with two sets of uniform to all girls, ST boys, SC boys and BPL boys. The provision has been provided to Textbook Section as per the following: -

C. Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Awasiya Vidyalaya (Residential Schools/Hostels

The Residential Schools/Hostels (Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Awasiya Vidyalala) is covered upto Elementary Level. In Sikkim there are four Residential Hostels namely, HeeGyathang SSS, Mangan SSS under Mangan district, Yuksom SSS under Gyalshing district and Soreng SSS under Soreng district.

Objectives:

- > To create awareness of nearby surrounding,
- > Focus on experimental learning.

Most of the Residential Hostels like HeeGyathang Senior Secondary School, Passingdong Secondary School, Lum Primary School, etc. are initiating good practices like Organic Farming. They produce green vegetables, maize, ginger beans etc. and they use it in the hostel for the children. The other good initiatives adopted by Lum Primary School is that the Committee bought the cow for the hostel. The hostel in-charge distribute the milk to the students in the morning and evening respectively.

All the Residential Hostel constituted the Committee comprising of one official from District Education Office, Ward Panchyat, Principal of the School, Local guardians etc.

The best practices adopted by Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Awasiya Vidhayala (Residential Hostels) during the year 2023-24 are placed below.

The various activities conducted by the Residential Hostels are: -

- 1. Academic Activity such as Physical Training, Morning Prayer, Morning Speech, Preparatory Time for the students.
- 2. Co-Curricular Activities such as Quiz, Yoga, Musical Performance, Arts Show, Organic Food, etc.
- 3. In collaboration other activities such as Health Camp, Organic Farming, etc.
- 4. Sports Activities such as Football, Badminton, Kho-Kho, etc.



In the PAB 2023-24, the State had proposed two new Hostels, Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Awasiya Vidhalaya (Residential Hostels) for Yuksom Senior Secondary School under Gyalshing District and Soreng Senior Secondary School under Soreng District with a capacity of 100 students each in Schools and hence it was approved by the Project Approval Board 2023-24. Thus, Yuksom Senior Secondary School and Soreng Senior Secondary School are operational since August 2023 with 100 students and 50 students respectively. Furthermore, there are two Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Awasiya Vidhalaya (Residential Hostels) at Government Girls Senior Secondary School, Mangan with a capacity of 50 students and Government Senior Secondary School, HeeGeythang with a capacity of 100 students under Mangan District are operational.

Finally, the State Level Kala Utsav 2023-24 was conducted on 9th November 2023 in the Auditorium of Sir Tashi Namgyal Senior Secondary School, Gangtok. The total participants from all the 6 (six) districts were 88 (eighty-eight) to participate in the State Level Kala Utsav 2023-24. Among 88 participants, 20 (twenty) students are selected from all 10 categories, i.e. 10 girls and 10 boys from each category to participate in the National Level Kala Utsav 2023-24.







Finally, the National Level Kala Utsav 2023-24 was conducted from 9th January to 12th January 2024 at New Delhi. The twenty (20) participants including 10 male and 10 female from all 10 Categories participated in the National Level Kala Utsav 2023-24. Fortunately, Master Sahil Rai, Class XII of West Point Senior Secondary School, Gangtok had been awarded Bronze Medal in Dance Classical Category.





E. Self Defence Training for Girls.

Self Defence Training for girls of Class VI to Class XII of all the Government schools of Sikkim was proposed for the PAB 23-24. Self-defence training instills self confidence amongst girls and helps to promote girl's education particularly their transition to Secondary and Higher Secondary level and to reduce the drop-out rate. Through self-defence techniques, girls are taught to increase their core strength. This is specially aimed to strengthen girls' enrolment at the school level.

Under this intervention, an amount of Rs 25.05 Lakhs for Elementary schools and Rs 31.35 lakhs for Secondary girls was approved. The training programme was done in collaboration with the Sports and Youth Affairs Department, Government of Sikkim during the month of November 2023 – March 2024. A total of 110 Master trainers provided by the Sports Department who were experts in the field of various disciplines of sports were

entrusted to impart the training to the beneficiaries. The training was conducted in all the JHS, SS and SSS of Sikkim and was successfully concluded as per the schedule.







F. Yoga programme.

Under the intervention of Yoga under Samagra Shiksha, we have organized basic Yoga training of three days to the untrained teachers of Soreng and Pakyong Districts, refresher training course of two days for existing yoga trainers of Rakdong Tintek and Passingdong Blocks (in phases) and celebrated International Yoga Day at all levels. A team of 16 participants and 4 escorts participated in the National Yoga Olympiad held at Regional Institute of Education, Bhopal Madhya Pradesh from 18th June 2023 to 20th June 2024. In this National level event, our Middle stage girl's category participants secured First position and were awarded gold medal.

The total financial sanction in the PAB under Yoga for 2023-24 was Rs 11.12 Lakhs for Elementary level and Rs 4.18 Lakhs for Secondary level only and the same was utilized as per the Guidelines.








G. BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO

"BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO" was unleashed with an objective of addressing the declining child Sex Ratio (CSR) and other issues related to the women empowerment to help remove gender based discrimination and elimination, to protect girls' child. **"BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO"** was launched by the Honourable Prime Minister of India on 22nd January 2015 at Panipat, Haryana, "Sukanya Samriddhi Youjana" launched by the Government of India in 2015 as part of **"BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO"** campaign to encourage saving for the Girls Childs future.

In this connection, State Project Office, Samagra Shiksha conducted "BAC Level Adolescent Programme for Girls Students of Elementary and Secondary School at all 33 Block Level (BACs) from 19.06.2023 to 08.11.2023 with the involvement of resource person from Health Department, Police Department and Social welfare Department, Government of Sikkim. H. Inter School Band Competition, 2023-24:

Inter School Band Competition is started in the year 2017 to inculcate the sprite of patriotism and unity among School Students, the component is open for all categories of School and to be organised at three levels viz. State, Zonal and National Level.

State Project Office, Samagra Shiksha, Education Department, Government of Sikkim organized, State Level Inter-School Band Completion on 06.11.2023, in which a total of 06 Schools from the four districts participated out of Six District. In this band competition, 01 Boys Category (Brass Band), 02 Boys Category (Pipe Band) and 03 Girls category (Pipe Band) has participated. West Point Sr. Sec. School, Boys category (Brass Band), Soreng Sr. Sec. School, Boys Category (Pipe band) and Chakung Sr. Sec. School, Girl's category (Pipe band has selected for Zonal Level, band competition at Odisha on 22.12.2023.

West Point Sr. Sec. School, Boys category (Brass Band) took first position in Zonal Level Band Competition and participates at National Level Band Competition on 21.01.2024 at New Delhi and won National Level Band competition, 2024.

This section plays an important role for regulating policies as well as implementation of schemes that have been formulated by the Government for the promotion of Quality Education in the state. School Education [SE] Section in coordination with other Departments and Agencies played a vital role in implementation of the following schemes/programme in the year 2023-2024.

- BAHINI SCHEME was implemented in Sikkim in the year 2023-24 by providing 100% access to free and safe sanitary pads to all adolescent school going girl children of Classes VIII XII.
- These initiatives curbed the dropout girls from schools and raise awareness about menstrual hygiene & adopting healthy life style.
- Under this Scheme, CSR initiatives of NHPC also provided Vending Machine and Incinerator in 134 Secondary and Sr. Secondary Schools.





REPORT ON PARIKCHA PE CHARCHA:

- ➤ PPC is a noble initiative to address the issue of examination phobia. The 7th edition of ParikchaPeCharcha was scheduled on 29th Jan. 2024 with Hon'ble PM Narendra Modi.

The Sikkim State Teacher's Recruitment Board was established in the year 2014 vide Notification No.935/Dir/HRDD, dated: 19.11.2014 with the view for selection of various School Heads (Principal Sr. Sec. School, HM Sec. School, HM Jr. High School & HM Primary School) and to select teachers for appointment to Government Schools of Sikkim as provided by Education Department (Pre-Primary Teachers, Primary Teachers, Graduate Teachers & Post Graduate Teachers) Recruitment Rules 1991.

The main function of the Board is to conduct direct recruitment for selection to the post of Teachers for various Government Schools i.e. from Pre-primary Teacher up to the level of Post Graduate Teacher and also to conduct promotional Examination of various schools Heads duly following the guidelines of National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) by conducting examination, interviews and recommending the names of selected candidates to the department for appointment.

Hence, in accordance to the requirement of the letter no 547/PLG/EDN dated 12/04/2023, it is to mention that during the year 2022-2023, the Screening-cum-Interview of the Probationary Teachers, regularization process of all the Probationary Teachers who have completed 08 years of continuous service as on 31.12.2021 was conducted. Also, the promotional exam to the post of HM JHS and HM PS was conducted. The Screening-cum-Interview was also conducted for the various posts of teachers for EMRS. In the same year, Screening-cum-Interview was conducted for the post of Special Educators for Secondary & Senior Secondary and Elementary Level under Inclusive Education of Samagra Siksha.

The final phase of Verification and Screening of the left out Probationary Teachers was conducted who were not shortlisted before owing to non-possession of Academic or Professional Qualifications as per NCTE Norms. A clarification was sought and according to the directions of the Department the IV and Final Phase of regularization was conducted.

These 20 (twenty) institutions all function as autonomous HEIs within the territorial jurisdiction of the State of Sikkim.

- a) Regularisation of Assistant Professors posted in Sikkim Government Colleges under Education Department: 68 Assistant Professors who had completed 06 years of service on adhoc basis as on 31/12/2023 were regularised.
- **Scheme**: Ms. Kursongkit Lepcha and Ms. Norzim Eden Bhutia were selected under this scheme in the F.Y 23-24. Ms. Kursongkit Lepcha is pursuing M.Phil. from the University of Cambridge while Ms. Norzim Eden Bhutia is pursuing M.Sc. (Soil Mechanics with Engineering Geology) from the Imperial College London.
- **c) APATAN Scheme:** Scholarship to the tune of ₹ 1,80,000/- was released to 06 scholars pursuing PH.D in Nepali during the F.Y 2023-34.
- **d) Bahini Scheme:** A total of ₹20 allocated in the State Budget was utilised under this scheme for providing sanitary napkins to female students of 15 Sikkim Government higher educational institutions.
- e) Exposure Trip for Sikkim Government College Students: 110 students of various Sikkim Government colleges were selected on merit basis and sent on an exposure trip to Delhi-Agra-Jaipur.
- f) Accreditation by NAAC for NBBGC (2nd Cycle): Nar Bahadur Bhandari Government College applied for the 2nd cycle of NAAC Accreditation and was awarded the grade of B++ on 11/04/2023. This is the highest grade accorded to a Sikkim Government college by NAAC till date.
- g) New Language Departments Established in Khangchendzonga State University: Three new Masters' degree courses; MA (Bhutia), MA (Lepcha) and MA (Limboo) were introduced by the University.
- h) 14 Posts of Professor Notified for Sikkim Government Colleges: The Education Department has notified 14 posts of Professor for Sikkim Government College. These posts will be used exclusively for promotion of

eligible Associate Professors to the next higher post of Professor in accordance to the Career Progression Scheme notified by UGC.

i) Establishment of New Private Universities in the State: As per the Government policy, efforts have been made to establish a new private University in every district of the State. Accordingly, bills for establishing 12 new private Universities in some of the rural areas of the State has been passed by the Sikkim Legislative Assembly during the F.Y 2023-24.

Netaji Subash Chandra Bose University of Excellence (NSBUoE)

Introduction

To enhance and improve the quality of Higher Education in the state of Sikkim, the Netaji Subash Chandra Bose University of Excellence (NSBUoE), initially conceived as the Centre of Excellence (CoE), is being established at Chakung, Soreng District, West Sikkim. The University, based on liberal studies, is also positioned to be a knowledge hub with emphasized study and research activities pertinent to the sensitive region of the Eastern Himalayas. This State Government project is seen as a priority project being executed by the Education Department. The University has been enacted as a State University under the PPP model in April 2022. The Implementing Agency selected through an e-tender process is M/S. SIBIN Group as the lead partner. A Contract Agreement was signed between the State Government and the Lead Partner, M/S SIBIN Group, on 6th April 2021.

About NSBUoE Secretariat

The NSBUoE Secretariat was established under the Directorate of Higher Education, Education Department, and has been operational since April 2021.

- 1. Coordinate with other departments/agencies/sections for NSBUoE-related work.
- 2. Conduction of Meetings with various Mentor Cohorts, committees, and officials.
- 3. Assist the Engineering Section in monitoring the progress of the civil works at the site.
- 4. Maintain documentation relating to the project.

Budget Provision:

For the financial year 2023-24, NSBUoE Secretariate was allocated a budget provision of ₹40,00,000/-. Activities to be covered were:

DISTRIBUTION OF TEXTBOOK

The Textbook Directorate is one of the major components under Education Department that caters the needs of educational institutions and the pupils studying across the state of Sikkim.

The Textbook Directorate is carrying out the task of fulfilling the demand of the thousands of students studying across the state, with optimal zeal and dedication.

Unlike past years, this time, with collective effort of all the stakeholders, wear able to provide our students across the state with all the school stationeries ranging from school textbooks to shoes and socks for the students on the very first day of the academic session 2024.

SOME OF THE NEWSPAPER HEADLINES ON TEXTBOOK DISTRIBUTION



To achieve the goal of Compulsory Elementary Education and to provide quality education in the State, the Government has introduced many beneficiary schemes. In this endeavor, the Textbook Section of Education Department, Government of Sikkim has been implementing various schemes for the welfare of students of Sikkim.

The following beneficiary items are provided during the year under report to the students of Government Schools:

1. SCHOOL UNIFORMS:

Annually distributed items like Pant, Shirt, Skirts, Tunic and Bakhu set are provided to the students of Government Schools from Classes Pre-Primary/LKG/UKG to VIII free of cost amounting to Rs.117.75 Lakhs and for the purchase of fabrics for stitching uniforms by self-help group under SRLM/RDD amounting to Rs.108.83 Lakhs.

In compliance to decision of the present Government, the department awarded stitching of 50,000 numbers of Uniforms amounting to Rs.121.33 lakhs to Self-Help Groups through SRLM-RDD, Government of Sikkim to encourage and make self-reliant to the local entrepreneurs. For stitching of school uniforms 36 nos of Self-Help Groups are involved and 720 nos of local entrepreneurs are engaged and earning their livelihood.

2. SHOES & SOCKS:

One pair of shoes and two pairs of socks are distributed to all the Government Schools free of cost to the students from Classes Ito V and Classes VI to VIII of notified Government Schools located at remote areas.

The total expenditure incurred towards the procurement of shoes and socks for the year under report is Rs.271.80 Lakhs

3. EXERCISE COPIES:

Exercise Copies are also distributed free of cost to the students from Classes Pre-Primary/LKG/UKG to VIII of all Government Schools. Total expenditure on Exercise copies amounts to Rs. 82.50Lakhs

Textbook Directorate's role on GLOF affected districts of Sikkim

In the early hours of October 4, the glacier-fed South Lhonak Lake in North Sikkim breached, causing a Glacial Lake Outburst Flood (GLOF) that destroyed the state's largest hydro power plant and left at least 35 people dead and around 104 missing as on October 9. Consequently, hundreds of students were left homeless and all the learning materials were washed away by the flood on the fateful day.

So, to cope with the issue of unavailability of learning materials a team from Directorate of Textbook and Languages, Education Department, Government of Sikkim organized a One-Day Tour on 18th October 2023 to distribute Textbooks and Exercise copies to schools with students affected by Glacial Lake Outburst Flood (GLOF) of Gangtok and Pakyong Districts.

The main objective of the tour was to provide textbooks and exercise copies to students affected by GLOF and help them regain access to Education which would contribute to their resilience and recovery from disaster.

Among the Government schools, a complete set of textbooks were given to Kindergarten Classes of the affected Schools, 90% of textbooks were given to the affected students of classes III to VIII and 100% textbooks were given to the affected students of classes IX to XII. Likewise, a complete set of Exercise copies were given to the affected students studying in government schools of both the districts.

A total of 8160 exercise copies were distributed to the affected students of private schools falling under both the districts. As the academic curriculum of private institutions is different from that of government Schools, the textbooks could not be given to the affected students of private schools.

SCHOLARSHIP SECTION

- 1. Chief Minister's Merit Scholarship Scheme (CMMSS)
 - The Chief Minister's Merit Scholarship Scheme (CMMSS) started in the year 2010 for the students of marginalized families of the state.
 - The 55 students who qualify at the state level are admitted in class VI to reputed public school within state and is fully sponsored by the State Government, out of which 5 seats are exclusively for Lepcha Students from Dzongu Area who are given admission in TNA.
 - From 2024 five (05) students from Lachen-Lachung-Chungthang Area has been provided with exclusive

Reservation for admission under this scheme.

- Children with Special Need (CWSN) have been given 4% horizontal reservation from 2021 from the 60 seats.
- The total no of students studying under this scheme within and outside State till 2024 is 1212.
- The CMMSS students were able to secure position in the NEET examination and three of them got admission to MBBS Course in the year 2023.
- From 2024,10 students were selected for admission to Class IX at Pinegrove School, Himachal Pradesh.



2. CMMSS Extended upto Graduation Level: This scheme is implemented smoothly to help the children of CMMSS at Graduation level to support them for further studies. The scholarship includes reimbursement of Registration Fee, Accommodation Fee, Tuition Fee and Examination Fee. In the year 2024, Rs. 1.21 crores have

been paid to the batch of 2023.

3. PRERNA AND MERIT SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME: —Students selected in Class V through open Competitive Examination conducted by the Exam Section at the Sub-Division level are being provided the scholarship.

Every year 54 students are selected under this scholarship scheme in class VI and 36 students in class IX.

- **4. POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP:** —The Post Matric Scholarship is granted to all local students under Merit and General categories for various courses within and outside the State.
- MERIT SCHOLARSHIPFOR HIGHEREDUCATION: Scholarship ranging from Rs. 800/-to Rs. 2,000/- p.m. is awarded to students with more than 80% marks in Class XII and annual reimbursement of maximum Rs. 10,000 will be awarded for some courses viz.MBBS/BDS, B. Tech/ B. Arch and some notified honors at graduation level. There is no income ceiling bar.
 - •GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR HIGHER EDUCATION: Annual reimbursement of maximum Rs.10,000/ is also awarded for some courses viz. MBBS/BDS, B.Tech/ B.Arch and some notified honors at graduation level for the students with 60%-80% marks in Class XII.The combined income of both the parents should be10,000/-per month.
- Scholarship is awarded for pursuing Ph. D courses@Rs.6,000/-p.m.for regular candidates with subject related to the State of Sikkim with a contingency grant of Rs.15,000/-per annum for a maximum period of three years and Rs.3,000/-p.m.forin-service candidates with reimbursement of Rs.12,000/-per annum, pursuing various courses within and outside the state.

- 5. SCHOLARSHIP TO SELECTED STUDENTS RASHTRIYA INDIAN MILITARY COLLEGE (RIMC) DEHRADUN AND SAINIK SCHOOL STUDENTS, GOALPARA(ASSAM) at `the rate of 20000/annum per student.

DIRECTORATE OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION

The Directorate of Technical Education (DTE) has been functioning in the Education Department since 1998. The DTE is entrusted with the responsibility of overseeing the functioning of the two polytechnics namely (i) Advanced Technical Training Centre (ATTC), Bardang, Pakyong district and (ii) Centre for Computers and Communication Technology (CCCT), Chisopani, Namchi district and one B.Tech degree college (iii) Sikkim Institute of Science and Technology (SIST), Chisopani, Namchi district. Both polytechnics are ISO 9001 certified institutions since 2007. More than 95% of courses have NBA accreditation. In the interest of the institute and also for maintaining the standard in academics these three colleges are registered as Society and are autonomous institutes managed by Boards of Management/Boards of Governors. For sustainability of these three institutes the State Government provides Grant-in-aid out of the State plan.

A. Advanced Technical Training Centre (ATTC), Bardang. Estd: 1999

The institute offers 05 diploma courses viz., Civil Engg., Computer Engg., Manufacturing Tech., Mechanical Engg. and Mechatronics in line with the free education policy of the State Government.

Academic Review and Monitoring

Academics in ATTC has always followed its Quality Policy of "Excellence in Technical Education". To aid the smooth functioning of academic monitoring, ATTC has its own Management Information Software (MIS) which has been instrumental in maintaining details such as student attendance, uploading of class notes, lectures, assignments, display of examination results which are accessible to all students and teachers. This software is also being used by the HoDs to monitor the general conduct and interaction between the teachers and students.

A monthly Academic Review Meeting is conducted by the Academic In charge in the presence of Head of Departments, Course In charges and the Principal to assess the class conduction, syllabus coverage, sessional test performance and project completion status of each branch. Any rating less than the desired 80% completion is investigated individually, and the teachers and students are then asked to conduct extra classes to ensure that the subject conduct is brought up to par.



E. State Board of Technical Education (SBTE)

The State Board of Technical Education (SBTE) was constituted in 2002. The DTE allots various State quota seats as per the State Reservation policy and as per the merit of the marks obtained in the qualifying examination. Since, 2021 the State Government has initiated the allotment of 50 free MBBS seats to the students of Sikkim at Sikkim Manipal University along with 30 full fees seats. A total of 92 candidates were nominated for MBBS course for session 2023-24. Altogether 786 students were nominated for State quota seats for the session 2023-24.

PM POSHAN/MID DAY MEAL

National Programme for Nutritional support to Primary Education PM POSHAN erstwhile Mid-Day Meal Scheme was launched as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 15th August, 1995 in a phased manner all over India. Its objective was to boost "Universalization of Elementary Education by increasing enrolment, retention, attendance and simultaneously impacting on nutrition of students in primary classes". The programme originally covered children of primary level (classes I to V) in government, local body and government aided schools. In October 2002, the programme was extended to cover children studying in Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) & AIE centers and from the same year the hot cooked meal was started in the State of Sikkim. Prior to the year 2001-02 the food grain (Rice) provided by the Government of India @3kgs per child per month for 10 academic months in a year, was distributed as dry rations to the children. However, the Supreme Court in its order dated: 28.11.2001 in WP(C) NO. 196 of 2001- People's Union for Civil Liberties versus Union of India and other, directed all the state governments to provide cooked Hot Meal containing 300 calories and 8 to 10 grams of protein per serving.

Cooked hot Meal served to school children of Sikkim up-to Primary level (class I-V) from 2002 and from class (VI-VIII) are being provided from the academic session 2008.

There are six districts including two new Soreng & Pakyong district approved by the government during 2021-22 headed by the Chief Education Officers at district level, Jt. Director at Sub-Division level and Dy. Director/Asst. Director at Block Administrative Centers who are implementing agencies of PM Poshan at school level. Fortified rice from 2021-22 onwards were distributed instead of common rice to upgrade the health of children.

With the introduction of Public Funding Management System [PFMS] by the central government in all the Central Sponsored Schemes from 2021-22. PM POSHAN erstwhile Mid-Day Meal Cell, Education Department has successfully onboard PFMS by opening of State Nodal Agency [SNA] A/C at state level, Implementing Agencies [IA] A/C at district level and vendor A/C of all the schools covered under PM Poshan to cater the scheme effectively.

- ❖ The main aims and goal of the PM POSHAN/MDM Scheme in schools is to stop drop out from schools.
- ❖ Provide hot cooked meal in the schools so that the students can pay attention to their education.
- Develop healthy body by providing nutritious food.

❖ PM POSHAN/MDM shall encourage gender equalities and eliminates social barriers.

TEACHER EDUCATION IN SIKKIM (SCERT)

State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT) Sikkim is one of the directorates of Education Department, Govt of Sikkim which has also been designated as the academic authority of the Education Department. SCERT performs multiple functions of diverse nature pertaining to school and teacher education. Important functions of SCERT includes capacity building of teachers, Head of Schools, Officials of Education Department, Development of curriculum and learning resources for teachers and students, conducting educational research and survey, networking and collaborating with various national and regional organisations and institutes and providing academic support to other directorates and institutes within the state.

The functions of SCERT Sikkim can be summarised under following heads:

- 1. Development of Textbooks, Curriculum and Resource Materials
- 2. Capacity Building of Teachers, Heads of Institutions and Officials
- 3. Intervention Programmes for Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) in the State
- 4. Educational Research and Surveys
- 5. Seminars and Conferences
- 6. Nodal agency for organising and implementing National and Regional Programmes
- 7. Programmes for strengthening Science Education in the state
- 8. Support to other directorates of Education Department and other institutions

SCERT Sikkim organised following activities during the period from 1st April 2023 to 31st March 2024:

1. Development of Textbooks, Curriculum and Learning Resources

1. Review of D.El.Ed Curriculum

A 5 – day workshop was organised from July 3-7,2023 for the review of Curriculum of 2 -Year Pre-service Diploma in Elementary Education (D.El.Ed). The workshop was attended by faculty members of DIETs – Gangtok, Namchi & Gyalshing. The objective of the workshop is to review the D.El.Ed curriculum and revise it in the light of NEP 2020.

2. Development of Resource Materials for New India Literacy Programme (NILP)

State Centre for Literacy (SCL), SCERT Sikkim which works under the aegis of Cell of National Centre for Literacy (CNCL), NCERT, New Delhi developed the resource materials for adult learners under New India Literacy Programme (NILP). The resource materials comprise of 4 volumes of primers, question bank, assessment sheets, worksheets, test papers and advocacy posters. The resource materials have been submitted to CNCL-NCERT for uploading on DIKSHA vertical.

3. Advisory on Instructional Time Management

SCERT Sikkim has developed an Advisory on Instructional Time Management which served as a template for all schools across the state. The advisory was sent to the Education Department based on which a rationalised instructional time table at foundational level in schools was developed as per the recommendation of National Curriculum Framework for Foundational Stage (NCF-FS).

2. Capacity Building Programmes for Teachers, Heads of School, Teacher Educators and Officials of Education Department

In the year 2023-24, various departments/cells of SCERT Sikkim organised different training programmes as mentioned below for teachers and head of institutions with the objective of building their capacity in different areas:

- i) One day Orientation Programme of Block Resource Co-ordinators (BRCCs) on National Curriculum Framework (NCF FS) 2022 was organized on 20th of September 2023. The orientation was organised under the aegis of the State Leadership Academy, SCERT, Gangtok wherein 29 BRCCs from different Educational Blocks of the State participated. The programme revolved around the various aspects of NCF-FS 2022 concerned with the foundational stage of education.
- ii) A 2 Day workshop on Art & Craft was organised on 9th and 10th Dec 2023 by SCERT Sikkim. The objective of the workshop was to introduce the Work Education Instructors (WEIs), Art Education Instructors (AEIs) and teachers teaching SUPW to various traditional Indian Art & Crafts and also to encourage them to create low-cost Art & Craft from waste materials and locally available resources. A first of its kind, the workshop was attended by 20 participants comprising of 15 teachers from Government schools of Gangtok District, 03 lecturers from DIET Gangtok and 02 faculty from SCERT Sikkim.

- iii) A 3- Day Orientation Programme for Librarians of Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools of Sikkim was organized by SCERT Sikkim from 6th to 8th February 2024with the objective of building capacity of school librarians and help them perform their role effectively. A total of 47 librarians from different schools across the state attended the orientation programme.
- iv) A 5- Day Capacity Building of Key Resource Persons (KRPs) in Remote Sensing & Geographic Information System (GIS) Applications in was organised from 19th to 23rd Feb 2024. The programme was organised by North East Regional Institute of Education, NERIE, NCERT Shillong in collaboration with SCERT Sikkim. The objective of the programme was to train the teachers teaching

Geography in the use of Remote Sensing and GIS techniques and its application in Geography. The programme also familiarised the teachers on the use of recent Remote Sensing and GIS techniques and its applications. A total of 42 teachers from different schools of state participated in the programme.

- v) A 5 Day workshop for capacity building of KRPs on FLN was conducted by NERIE NCERT, Shillong in collaboration with SCERT during 4th- 9th March 2024. The objective of the workshop was to prepare KRPs for Foundational Literacy and Numeracy programme in the state.
- vi). A 1 Day Orientation Programme of 80 School heads on National Curriculum Framework-School Education (NCF-SE) 2023 was organized for Gangtok District on 21st March 2024 and for Mangan & Pakyong Districts on 22nd March 2024 at SCERT, Lower Burtuk, Gangtok, Sikkim. The orientation programme was attended by 33 heads of Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools of Gangtok district, 37 school heads of Pakyong district and 10 school heads of Mangan district respectively. The objective of the programme was to orient the school heads on various aspects of NCF on School Education.

vii). Orientation programme on Curriculum for Out of School Children (

OoSC): One day orientation programme on Curriculum for Out of School Children (OoSC) was organised by State Project Office, Samagra Shiksha, Education Department at SCERT Sikkim. The programme was meant to orient Block Resource Centre Coordinators (BRCCs), Cluster Resource Centre Coordinators (CRCCs), MIS

Coordinators and School Heads of Gangtok District on the technical aspects and modalities of OoSC. Ms. Larissa Lepcha, Resource Person, SCERT Sikkim briefed the participants on various aspects of the curriculum developed for OoSC by SCERT Sikkim.

viii). Consultative Meet on Holistic Progress Card: One-day Consultative Meet on Holistic Progress Card was organised by SCERT Gangtok for BRCCs & CRCCs of Pakyong, Mangan, Gangtok, Soreng and Gyalshing Districts on 16th March 2024 and for Namchi district on 18th March 2024. The objective of the consultative meet was to make participants aware about the transformation in Educational Assessment as envisaged by NEP 2020, NCF-FS and SE to familiarize the participants about the Holistic Progress Card prepared by Performance Assessment, Review and Analysis of Knowledge for Holistic Development (PARAKH) and to discuss and deliberate upon the implementation of HPC in our state.

ix). Annual Retreat for Teacher Educators: SCERT Sikkim has been organizing annual retreat for officials and faculty of SCERT. This programme is organized with objectives like team building, creating cordial and pleasant workplace environment, improving organizational climate, and developing high performance culture. The recent annual retreat was organized during 18th -22nd September 2023 at Azim Premji University, Bengaluru.

3. Special Intervention Programmes for Foundational Literacy and Numeracy in the State

In the light of the recommendation of NEP 2020, SCERT Sikkim has started some intervention programmes designed specifically for achieving Foundational Literacy and Numeracy in the state by 2026-27. Some of the special programmes are as mentioned follow

i) Special Numeracy Programme with Innovative Pedagogy

Aligned with the NIPUN Bharat- NIPUN Sikkim mission, the Special Numeracy Programme was initiated in 2023-24 in 245 selected schools across 6 districts in Sikkim. It evolved from the need to focus on the development of Number sense during the Foundational years (3 to 8 years). Numeracy being a key component and an area where teachers require more support, it was felt that a programme be developed where teachers are supported, and children learn joyfully in a fear free environment. The first step was to train and develop a set of State Resource Group (SRGs) and Mentors who would be instrumental in taking the whole mission to other schools where SCERT and DIET would find difficulty in supporting teachers directly. The identification of SRGs and Mentors was done by the office of Chief Education Officers of respective districts. They were selected from an identified pool of primary teachers teaching Mathematics in classes 1 & 2. The whole design of the programme revolves around the following components:



- 1. **Nodal Schools:** Nodal schools in districts act as an exemplar school where SRGs and Mentors try out new activities, classroom demonstrations and carry out initial assessments with the children of that schools with support from resource person from Jodogyan, SCERT and DIET. The whole workshop for both SRGs and Mentors takes place in the Nodal schools. There are 8 Nodal Schools spread over the six districts. Since all workshops and training happen with children of nodal schools, it is expected that the teachers of these schools will be more acquainted with the activities and the children become more familiar and better equipped with strong foundational number sense.
- 2. **SRG Schools:** 33 SRG schools have been identified across all the 33 blocks along with 33 SRG teachers who will act as the resource person at the block level. SRG schools will also become the centre for training mentor teachers identified from the cluster schools.
- 3. **Mentor Schools:** There are 106 clusters and two teachers have been identified from each cluster totaling 212 mentor teachers who are given training every month in their respective district nodal schools. The mentors are going to be the key when the programme is upscaled across all the schools in the state. Mentors from each cluster along with the support of SRG and DIET will be training all the teachers at the cluster level.

The workshop follows a cyclic pattern where new activities are conducted with the children of nodal schools in the presence of SRGs and mentor teachers. These activities are done at the school level by the SRGs and mentors with their own children. The teachers record all the activities day-wise in the register for each child. During district level workshops, discussion is held to understand how the classes have been conducted and what difficulties are faced by the teachers and children. The plan for each month is made with active participation of teachers.

So far, six workshops have been conducted for SRGs and Mentors. Baseline assessment of 60 schools for classes 1& 3 was completed in the month of April and the analysis is being carried out at present and the findings will also be presented.

ii). Development of Preschool Curriculum & Training of Pre – Primary Teachers on Early Childhood Care & Education (ECCE):

As mandated by National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, provisioning of quality early childhood development, care, and education must be achieved as soon as possible, and not later than 2030, to ensure that all students entering Grade 1 are school ready. (NEP 2020 - Page 7: Para 2).

In the light of above recommendations, SCERT Sikkim constituted aState Resource Group (SRG) that consisted of faculties of SCERT and DIETs – Gangtok, Namchi and Gyalshing for developing the pre-school curriculum. The SRG led by a coordinator was supported by Resource Persons from Azim Premji University and it took a total of 8 rigorous workshops between December 2022 – December 2023 to develop the curriculum. The Preschool Curriculum thus developed is in line with National Curriculum Framework – Foundational Stage (NCF-FS) 2022to providea guide for teacher to understand the learners, their learning needs, and the pedagogical processes to be followed at the foundational level – Preschool I, II &III.

After the development of curriculum, the SRG members trained the pre-primary Teachers (PPTs) in 14 training venues across the State from January 22- February 10,2024. During the training, PPTs werefamiliarized with the content and pedagogical processes to transact the curriculum in the classroom.

The teachers found the content and pedagogical processes meaningful and enjoyable and also found easy to implement in classroom.

iii). Development of FLN Module and Capacity Building of District Resource Persons (DRPs) on Foundational Literacy & Numeracy (FLN)

Foundational learning is the basis of all future learning for a child. Not achieving basic foundational skills of being able to read with comprehension, writing and doing basic mathematics operations, leaves the child unprepared for the complexities of the

curriculum beyond grade 3. Recognizing the importance of early learning, the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 states that "Our highest priority must be to achieve universal foundational literacy and numeracy in primary schools by 2026-27.(NEP 2020 Page No. 8)

National Initiative for Proficiency in Reading with Understanding and Numeracy (NIPUN Bharat Mission), has mandated to create a Pool of Key Resource Persons consisting of DIETs, SCERT, School Heads and Teachers for Mentoring and Guiding Teachers on FLN. Accordingly, the SCERT, Sikkim undertook the development of FLN Training Module and oriented the teachers who would work as District Resource Persons (DRPs) to train teachers at Block level. The module was developed through series of discussions held in three workshops held between August 2023 – January 2024.

The objective of developing the FLN module was to enable teacher follow the pedagogy to help students attain basic literacy and numeracy at foundational level. The activities given in the module are aligned to the content of textbooks (of Class I & II) thereby enabling the teachers to transact the content to facilitate students attain the FLN Goals. The development of FLN module was followed by orientation of DRPs from February 19-March 1,2024. A total of 152 DRPs have been trained and mapped to 33 blocks. This was further followed by training of teachers (2 teachers per school) by DRPs at Block level from March 20 -22,2024 & March 26-28,2024.

4. Educational Research and Surveys

SCERT Sikkim also conducts educational research on topics related to school education. Reports of such research programs are submitted to the Govt. through Education Department. SCERT has Research Cell which monitors and supervises research work undertaken by SCERT and DIETs.

In 2023-24, a total of five (05) research projects were undertaken by the faculty members of SCERT-Sikkim on various areas of school education as mentioned below:

- i. Effect of School Based Intervention on Mental Health and Social Adjustment of Students and Teachers of Secondary Schools.
- ii. A Study on Happiness among the Teacher Educators of Sikkim
- iii. Challenges and Opportunities of including Visually Impaired Students into Mainstream Education-A Case Study of a Senior Secondary School in South Sikkim
- iv. Role of Vocational Education in Schools and its Potential Impact on Employment in Sikkim.
- v. An Evaluative Study of Implementation and Effectiveness of Learning Enhancement Programme in the Schools of Sikkim.

5. Seminars and Conferences

 SCERT Sikkim regularly organises Seminars and Conferences on teacher education and allied areas. The 7th Edition of State Teacher Educators' **Conference 2023** was organised by SCERT Sikkim on 4th and 5th August 2023 where in 19 research papers were presented by faculty members of SCERT, DIETs, B.Ed. colleges and Sikkim University. The conference was also attended by faculty of different Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) within and outside the state, and representatives of National Organization and Institutes of repute including Azim Premji University, Bengaluru.

• In House seminars: More than 10 In House Seminars each lasting for more than 2 hours were organized by SCERT with an objective to build capacity of faculties of SCERT & DIETs on different emerging areas related to education. Some of the areas that were discussed during these seminars were: NCF-FS, NCF-SE, and Instructional Time Management for Schools.

6. Nodal agency for organising and implementing National and Regional Programmes

SCERT also works in collaboration with various national organisations and institutes of repute like NCERT (NERIE, NIE, CIET, PSSCIVE), NIEPA, CCRT, Azim Premji University and organises programmes in collaboration with these organisations and institutes. As the nodal agency, following national level programmes were organised by SCERT recently:

1. School Leadership Academy (SLA)

SCERT Sikkim also has a School leadership Academy (SLA) that functions as per the guidelines of National Centre for School Leadership (NCSL), National Institute of Educational Planning and Administration (NIEPA), New Delhi. SLA conducts various programmes on School Leadership for capacity building of school leaders.

In 2023-2024, NCSL, NIEPA, in collaboration with School Leadership Academy, SCERT organised a 3-day North East Regional Seminar on Whole School Development: Synergizing Leadership across School Ecosystem during 21st to 23rd Feb 2024. The seminar was organised to showcase and share the best practices of school heads under the theme of "Celebrating School Leadership". The programme was attended by School heads and members of SLAs from eight North-East states.

2. Population Education Cell:

Population Education Cell of SCERT organises various programmes on Adolescence Education, School Health and Wellness Programme (SHWP), Child Sexual Abuse and Personal Safety Education, Mental Health, Prevention of HIV & AIDS, Reproductive Health and Prevention of Substance Abuse etc. with academic and financial support from National Population Education Project of NCERT. Programs and Activities conducted by NPEP cell in 2023-24 can be categorised into following two categories:

I. Regular programmes

A. Training

- i) Training of Nodal Teachers of National Population Education Program was organized for 21 nodal teachers of Mangan, Gangtok and Pakyong districts during 23rd -24th August, 2023.
- ii) Training of 12-member State Resource Group (SRG) team on Community Sensitization and Good Parenting was conducted by Tata Institute of Social Science (TISS) Mumbai on 10th,17th and 18th July 2023.

iii) Training of Teacher Educators, School Heads and BRCs/CRCs on Child personal safety was conducted on 5th March 2024 in collaboration with ARPAN Foundation Mumbai. A total of 75 participants attended the programme.

3. Curricular Activities

Theme based Role Play and Folk Dance Competitions were organized at district and State level. Winners of these competitions represented state at regional and national programmes.

4. Research Studies

One research was conducted on the topic "Perception of issues and concerns of adolescent students of Sikkim specific to school health program".

i. Block Adoption Program for Sumbuk Block, Namchi District

14 schools under Sumbuk block were adopted for one financial year with the objective to build capacity of school heads, teachers, community members, parents and teachers on mental health in collaboration with Tata Institute of Social Science (TISS), Mumbai. Department of Health & Family Welfare, Sikkim State AIDS Control Society, Department of Sports & Youth Affairs, Birds and Bees Talk (NGO) supported the program in various ways. As a part of the intervention, following activities were designed for the block which are based on themes of School Health and Wellness program:

ii. Community Sensitization

Sensitization programme was conducted for officials of Sumbuk Block, health educators, counsellors, special educators, representatives of various registered government & non-government organizations, religious organizations, SMCs, Local bodies etc.

- iii. Training of Teachers on School health & Wellness Curriculumwas organized for teachers of 14 schools of Sumbuk Block (JHS and above)
- **iv.** First Response Training for teachers on Mental Healthfor teachers was conducted by resource persons from TISS Mumbai
- **v.** Peer Support Training on Mental Healthfor students was conducted by the resource persons from TISS Mumbai.

vi. **PM e Vidya Programme :** PM e Vidya Programme is an initiative of Ministry of Education Govt. of India to provide one class with one tv channel to all the classes (I-XII) to impart supplementary teaching and build a resilient mechanism for education delivery.5 DTH TV Channels allotted to the State of Sikkim as a part of 200 PM e-Vidya DTH TV Channels were launched on 29th July 2023. Being the academic authority of the department, SCERT Sikkim is entrusted with the responsibility to implement PM e Vidya programme in the state. Video content based on school textbooks and are being telecast through these channels on free to air DTH and DISH TV channel No 2153, 2154, 2155, 2156 and 2157.

7. Programmes organised by SCERT for strengthening Science Education in the State:

(i) Science Drama

Science Drama is one of the Science Programmes of SCERT Sikkim. In previous years, it used to be conducted directly at the state level. However, in 2023 it was organised for the first time at district level. The programme was organised in collaboration with National Council for Science Museum (NCSM), Ministry of Culture, Government of India. The objective of the program is to encourage students, teachers and science communicators to explore experiment and use the powerful medium of drama as a means of science communication.

In 2023-24, District level science drama was organised in Namchi, Soreng and Gyalshing districts on 29th Aug 2023 and in Gangtok, Mangan and Pakyong districts on 1st Sept 2023. Later, the State Level Science Drama was organised in SCERT Sikkim on 12th Sept 2023. A total of 31 schools participated in the district level competition of which top 6 schools were invited for the State level competition. The winner of State level competition – Government Secondary School, Rinchenpong participated in the Regional Level Science Drama at Birla Institute of Technology and Museum, Kolkata on 27th September 2023.

ii). Science Seminar

SCERT Sikkim also organised Science Seminar for Children in collaboration with National Council for Science Museum (NCSM), Ministry of Culture, Government of India. The objective of the Science Seminar is to inculcate a spirit of scientific enquiry and analytical thinking in the minds of young students.

In 2023, District level science seminar was organised in in Namchi, Soreng and Gyalshing districts on 30th Aug 2023 and in Gangtok, Mangan and Pakyong districts 2nd Sept 2023. A total of 89 schools participated in the district level competition of which 12 schools (1st and 2nd place winners of district level competition) were invited to the State Level Seminar. The State Level Science Seminar was organised in SCERT Sikkim on 11th Sept 2023. Singtam Sr. Sec. School, Gangtok District, New Sec. School Namchi, Namchi District and Singhik Sec. School, Mangan District were adjudged 1st, 2nd and 3rd respectively. Singtam SSS represented the state at National Science Seminar held at Science City, New Delhi on 12th October 2023.

i. Rajya Stariya Bal Vaigyanik Pradarshani (Science Exhibition)

3 days Rajya Stariya Bal Vaigyanik Pradarshani (RSBVP) 2023-24 was organised at Sir Tashi Namgyal Senior Secondary School, Gangtok from 1st to 3rd Nov 2023. The Pradarshani (previously kno .wn as State Level Science, Mathematics and Environment Exhibition for Children) was organized in collaboration with National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), New Delhi. The theme for the exhibition was "Science and Technology for Society" with five subthemes viz. Health, LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment), Agriculture, Communication and Transportation and Computational Thinking. The objective of the exhibition was to provide a forum for children to pursue their natural curiosity, creativity and innovation. 2 students and one teacher escort from 38 government schools and 8 private schools comprising participated in the event. 7 government schools

and 3 private schools were selected in the exhibition. Govt. Sec. School Singhik was adjudged the winner in the government school category whereas Govt. Sr. Sec. School Soreng and Govt. Sr. Sec. School Temi secured second and third positions respectively. The other four schools selected were Sir Tashi Namgyal Senior Secondary School Gangtok, Govt. Sr. Sec. School Mangan, Namchi Girls' Sr. Sec. School and Govt. Sr. Sec. School Kaluk, Soreng. In the private school category, Paljor Namgyal Girls' SSS, Gangtok secured the first position while Taktse International School, Gangtok and North Sikkim Academy, Mangan were able to secure second and third position respectively.

These 10 selected schools later represented the state in Zonal Level Science Exhibition popularly known as Eastern India Science Fair held at Birla Industrial and Technology Museum (BITM), Kolkata in the first week of January 2024.

10. Open Air Science Show

Starting 2023-24, SCERT Sikkim also organised Open Air Science Show for secondary level students of government schools of Sikkim. The main objective of this program was to encourage students on learning by doing. The programme consisted of some exciting and interesting science activities like Fun science (demonstration of experiment that explains the underlying principles of various phenomena in science in a very enjoyable way), Surprising chemical reactions (unique demonstration experiments in chemistry that are surprising, entertaining and highly educative), Science magic miracle, bubble show and many others. A total of 900 students actively participated in the programme.
